
A Year in Review 2021 AMERICAN LEGION POST 121

The ability to adapt to challenges is ingrained in those who have served in the military. Despite continuing Covid interference during 2021, River Falls American Legion Post 121 was able to build on its history of serving veterans, youth, and the broader community. The year's accomplishments included:

- Providing Honor Guard military rites at 31 veteran funerals
- Placing flags and presenting Memorial Day colors, rifle salutes, and taps at area cemeteries, followed by hosting a Memorial Day community program at the Veteran's Memorial
- Presenting Veterans Day colors, rifle salutes, and taps at all local schools
- Honoring & celebrating 100th Birthdays for two post members
- Delivered fruit baskets to "shut-in" veterans on Veterans Day
- Providing virtual Post meeting options for those unable to attend in person
- Conducting official flag retirement ceremony for River Falls Community
- Distributing more than \$30,000 to causes that include veteran in need and their families; scholarships; school and youth programs; funds to allow needy youth to participate in extracurricular activities; the school backpack program; Big Brother/Sisters; Christmas gifts for four veteran families; and more
- Presenting school medal awards to four students; sponsoring Legion junior and senior baseball teams and a local cub scout pack
- Developing and implementing a Leadership & Character Development program at Meyer Middle School
- Holding a community care package drive for deployed troops
- Sponsoring three blood drives that collected 472 units of blood from 439 donors
- Lending medical equipment to those in need
- Sponsoring a special community breakfast with Santa and Mrs. Claus
- Providing facility space for community and veteran group events
- Attaining an all-time high in membership for the sixth year in a row!

A personal highlight for the past 6 months was being able to attend virtually the induction of Derrick Schmidt into the MN Air National Guard's newly established Flight of Honor. He was one of nine, and the only NCO Air Guard member inducted; two were Generals. A very distinct honor for one of our own.

Don Matzek's 100th Birthday recognition in November was clearly a second highlight for the Post. Member Arnold Roen also recently celebrated his 101st Birthday. We now have two 100-year-old members.

By September Covid diminished enough so that WelHaven resumed their monthly veteran luncheon and invited one post member to attend.

We use that time to keep veterans living there updated on Post activities.

With the invaluable help of Post member, retired Judge Joe Boles, we are moving very close to the adoption of an agreement with the Veterans Memorial governing group which will incorporate that beautiful memorial into the Post for ongoing management and oversight. In doing so, we thank Neil Anderson for all he has done over the years to develop and support the memorial. Neil will continue to be deeply involved with the memorial.

The Post was able to provide \$3,600 to 4 veteran families with a total of six children as part of the community Christmas gifting program. That effort was primarily funded by the \$100 from 100 fundraiser this past year.


If you haven't been to one of our chicken frys, please stop by. It is an excellent meal. You can order take-out, or you can dine-in with your family and enjoy the conversation.
